<u>Back to School BBQ</u> – The Foundation will collaborate with the Student Senate and the Iron Range Engineering program to sponsor a Back-to-School BBQ for approximately 250 students on August 31.

<u>Collaborative Efforts - Alumni Association</u> – The Mesabi Range Foundation has collaborated with Minnesota State University – Mankato to partner in offering scholarships for the Iron Range Engineering program for several years. This year the Foundation added the Alumni Association to our scholarship application program to provide one website for Mesabi Range students to apply for all the scholarships available to them. The Foundation continues to collaborate with several local civic organizations to provide their scholarship opportunities for students.

Collaborative Efforts - Minnesota North campuses — As the six campuses have merged to form Minnesota North College, the Foundations at each campus are also trying to find new ways in which to collaborate and share ideas. During the 2023-24 academic year we will begin sharing one scholarship website for all Minnesota North students. All Minnesota North college-wide scholarship applications will be available to students through this website, as well as the campus specific scholarships that were offered in the past. Through this collaboration there will be a significant savings to each Foundation for their scholarship application expenditures.

John Klarich, a native of Buhl, graduated from Martin Hughes High School and then earned a degree in Education from Bemidji State in 1973. His advanced degrees in School Administration were earned at the University of Minnesota, Duluth.

During his professional career, which spanned 50 years, John served as an elementary school teacher, Work Experience Coordinator and Principal at Remer; Elementary Principal/Superintendent at Nashwauk -Keewatin; Elementary Principal/Superintendent at Mt. Iron-Buhl; served two terms as Mayor of Buhl; and finally, served as Superintendent at Ely. A stellar career, for sure!



He previously served as a board member for the Range Association of Municipalities and School Boards and the Arrowhead Regional Computing Consortium (for 20 years each). He has expertise in strategic planning, public relations, marketing, and legislative contacts. Currently John serves as a board member on the Central Iron Range Sanitary Sewer District, the St. Louis County Community Development Block Grant Committee; and, since 1995 has been a board member for the North East Service Cooperative. Through all of John's experience in education, he is keenly aware of pre-K through Grade 12 educational needs across the entire Iron Range, in addition to the needs of graduating seniors. He is a proud graduate of Hibbing Community College and supports the new visions of the Minnesota North College.



Sue Long

Sue Long, a graduate from Mt. Iron High School, received her Associate in Applied Science Degree in Marketing/Management from Mesabi Community and Technical College in 1987. For ten years she put her skills to use at Herberger's and attained the title of Divisional Manager. Sue always had a passion for helping people and after her daughter and son were born, she returned to school in 1996, graduated two years later as a registered nurse and worked at Essentia Health and Fairview.

When asked to join the board, Sue immediately responded with "Yes! I always enjoy doing what I can to enrich the lives of others." She brings a lot of prior board experience to the foundation because she served as secretary on the board of directors of the United Way of NE MN, was a board member of the Iron Range Mental Health Task Force, and lead the Essentia Health AFSCME Local as Vice President and President.

Currently, Sue lives at Spirit Lake with her husband Dan and her two Yorkshire Terriers and volunteers at the American Legion. Her daughter, Alex, is a Nuclear Engineer at the Nuclear Regulatory Commission in Washington, D.C., and her son Kennedy is a Music Director in Brainerd, Minnesota. In her spare time, Sue is a casual employee at Canelake's Candies in Virginia.

Gary Cerkvenik

Gary Cerkvenik, a hands-on organizer who brings creativity and passion to issues, is a strong communicator and consensus builder with broad experience in the private and public sectors. He has been a consultant in politics, economic development, federal/state lobbying, and in the energy field. His client work includes the Mesabi Trail, running from the Mississippi to the Boundary Waters, Heliene, Minnesota's only solar module manufacturer, Essentia Health's Vision Northland new Hospital, and most recently the Voyageurs National Park Clean Water Project.



In politics, he was elected the youngest Chair of the St. Louis County Board to playing a lead role in the 1988 Mike Dukakis for President campaign. He has worked for Congressman Jim Oberstar, Governor Rudy Perpich, Senator Paul Wellstone, Senator John Kerry, the Carter-Mondale campaign, and was the first Executive Director of the Minnesota DFL Party.

From organizing the largest event in the history of New England—Earth Day 1990 in Boston under Earth Day Founder Denis Hayes--to managing the first two stages of the Nature Valley Grand Prix professional bike races, Gary has a unique work history. He taught government and philosophy at the local college and was a co-founder/U.S. patent holder at Spring Creek Outfitters.

Gary's government relations and consulting firm, The Costin Group, Inc., is highly ranked in Minnesota. He holds the distinction of winning the Minnesota Border to Border Triathlon from Luverne, Minnesota on the lowa border to the Canadian Border. He graduated Cum Laude, BS in Government, Minor in Philosophy, and earned a MA in World War II Studies at Arizona State University.

MESABI RANGE FOUNDATION RECEIVES \$2,000 GRANT

The Mesabi Range Foundation was recently awarded a \$2,000 grant from Great River Energy to support the Foundation's effort to expand the promotion of scholarship opportunities, provide continued program support for the Foundation Office, and help support creative initiatives for the students attending the Mesabi Range campuses.

Great River Energy is a not-for-profit wholesale electric power cooperative that provides electricity to 27 member-owner distribution cooperatives. Together, their systems provide power to approximately two-thirds of Minnesota geographically and parts of Wisconsin, serving 700,000 families, farms and businesses.

"The Foundation is pleased to receive this grant award from Great River Energy, and will put it towards continuing the mission of our Foundation, in promoting extraordinary educational opportunities for the students, faculty, staff, and administration of the Mesabi Range campuses," said Sue Medure, President of the Mesabi Range College Foundation.
