Foundation Update By Scott Wirtanen, Foundation Coordinator

It has been another exciting and eventful few months in the Foundation Office as we disburse the Fall semester scholarships and begin to work with our donors for contributions for the 2026-27 academic year. The Donor Recognition Wall was completed during the past year and looks wonderful in the Commons area on the Virginia campus.

Student scholarships continue to be the main focus at our Foundation. Over 100 student scholarships totaling \$162,000 were awarded to Mesabi Range students through the Foundation.

During the past year we awarded \$50,000 in new scholarships for students on our Eveleth Campus enrolled in the Welding, Electrical Controls Maintenance and the Industrial Technology programs. In addition the Foundation became the administrator for the Tom Rukavina Mineral Royalties Scholarships. The Foundation awarded \$37,500 to scholarship recipients who are in a high demand degree program or career field and intend to remain in St. Louis County to help meet the growing workforce needs.

We are very pleased to continue the collaborative effort among all of the Minnesota North College campuses, formulating one scholarship portal for all students / potential students attending the Minnesota North College. This scholarship portal includes the Hibbing, Itasca, Mesabi Range, Rainy River and Vermilion Foundations. The scholarship portal allows students to make one application to all of the scholarships they qualify for at the home campus they are attending, as well as any additional scholarships provided through the Minnesota North College administrative offices.

Donor Profile—Tony & Joyce Nigro



The Tony and Joyce Nigro Scholarship was established in 2012 at the Mesabi Range Foundation. Their \$1,500 scholarship is given to a full-time student pursuing an Education Degree while maintaining a 3.0 grade point average. Tony and Joyce have awarded over \$28,000 in scholarships to students at Mesabi Range since the inception of their scholarship.

Tony, a Virginia High School graduate, attended Virginia Junior College from 1960-62. Tony earned his Bachelor's Degree from St. Cloud State University in 1965, and began his teaching career in Watertown, MN. In the 1970's Tony began working in Pharmaceutical sales, and later owned a boating business and was employed by State Farm Insurance in Red Wing, MN. During the 1980's Tony resumed his teaching career in the Eveleth and Virginia school districts for nine years prior to returning to work for State Farm Insurance for the final 10 years of his career.

Joyce, a Mt. Iron High School graduate, attended Mesabi State Junior College from 1969-70, and earned her Elementary

Education Degree from the University of Minnesota-Duluth in 1972, completing her Bachelor's Degree in three years. She began her teaching career at the Brainerd Public Schools before returning to the Iron Range to work for the St. Louis County School District. Joyce taught in several County Schools, including Toivola-Meadowlands (7 years), the Cherry School (2 years), the Alborn School (4 years) before returning to the Cherry School for the final 16 years of her teaching career.

Joyce and Tony both retired in 2005, and feel very fortunate to be able to give back to the youth on the Iron Range. They currently reside in Cherry, Minnesota and are very enthusiastic in supporting their community. They take great pride in assisting with the students at the Cherry School, and have contributed to the PTA, football, volleyball, boys' and girls' basketball, softball and baseball teams through various fund-raising activities.

In addition to the scholarships given in their name at Mesabi Range, Tony and Joyce have been active in providing scholarships for students at the University of Minnesota-Duluth and State Cloud State University.

The Mesabi Range Foundation Board of Directors and Mesabi Range faculty and staff are extremely grateful for the Nigro's charitable contributions and their support of the students attending the Mesabi Range campuses.

All Minnesota North Colleges received new score boards in our gyms. They are a much-needed improvement and look great too! Please check them out at one of our volleyball games this Fall.



Many college students face financial struggles funding their education. For many it is the first time away from home, and balancing a budget and making those decisions on their own can be very stressful. Often times students struggle to be able to provide enough food for themselves (and sometimes their families) because of increased tuition costs, inconsistency of food availability for them, increased family responsibilities, and everrising living expenses.

The Mesabi Range Campus Food Shelf gives students an opportunity to make sure they are getting proper nutrition when needed without having to struggle to allocate their money to do so.

Education - Partnering with organizations that build skills, including STEM skills, across all age groups; preparing a ready workforce; and increasing employment opportunities for community members.

Environment - Supporting organizations that protect and restore the environment through land and water restoration, creating green spaces, and promoting sustainable communities and natural areas.

Healthy and Vibrant Communities - Working to build healthy, safe, vibrant communities by providing services and creating opportunities for underserved populations; funding programs that promote healthy lifestyles and combat disease; and investing in community-improvement initiatives led by arts, cultural and civic institutions.

Cleveland-Cliffs has awarded over \$200,000 to the Mesabi Range campuses, including \$150,000 in 2015-2016 for a Nursing/Paramedic Simulation Lab, and student scholarship funding since 2014. Currently the Cleveland-Cliffs Foundation provides \$8,000 in annual scholarships for students in the field of Engineering and the technical trades.
